SHORT PROFILE

'Gbenga Sesan is the Executive Director of Paradigm Initiative Nigeria (PIN), a social enterprise that connects underserved people-groups with ICT-enabled opportunities. PIN's projects include Ajegunle.org (a capacity development initiative that connects the community's youth with training, internship and mentorship opportunities) and MISSPIN (the social campaign that is tackling cybercrime issues in Nigeria). Originally trained as an Electronic & Electrical Engineer at Obafemi Awolowo University, 'Gbenga completed Executive Education programs at Lagos Business School, New York Group for Technology Transfer, Oxford University, Harvard University, Stanford University, Santa Clara University and University of the Pacific. His consulting experience includes assignments completed for numerous institutions, including Microsoft, Harvard University, United Nations Economic Commission for Africa, Freedom House, Res Publica, Computer Aid International, Heinrich Boll Foundation, the International Telecommunications Union and British Council.

'Gbenga is very active on social media platforms, and has led change projects using these. In January

2010, he coordinated the technology and intense social media campaigns of the now-popular youth protest that led to the emergence of the EnoughisEnough Nigeria group. In 2011, 'Gbenga continued to lead technology projects for EnoughisEnough Nigeria, especially with the social media project tagged RSVP – Register. Select. Vote. Protect – which led a nationwide drive asking young Nigerians to turn out massively for voter registration exercises, select candidates based on available information, vote on election day, and protect their votes. 'Gbenga also coordinated the development of the first mobile application used for election monitoring in Nigeria, called ReVoDa (a play on the phrase, "Registered Voters' Database"). He served as a multi-role coordinator for the social media conversation and reports around the protests across Nigeria following the unpopular increase in pump price of petrol by the Nigerian government in January 2012.

'Gbenga's consulting and public speaking experience spans over 30 countries. A member of the United Nations Committee of eLeaders on Youth and ICT, he is a Crans Montana Forum Fellow, Archbishop Desmond Tutu Leadership Fellow, Ashoka Fellow, Our Common Future Fellow and Cordes Fellow.
